The following principles guide the activities of the All-Party Parliamentary Group (APPG) on the Rule of Law. The APPG on the Rule of Law:

- 1. Aims to promote parliamentary and public discussion of the rule of law as a practical concept, and a UK constitutional principle about which there is broad consensus.
- 2. Is a cross-party group that acts with political impartiality and does not undertake campaigning.
- 3. Welcomes as members all parliamentarians, regardless of party affiliation, and aims to involve a diverse range of parliamentarians including non-lawyers as well as lawyers.
- Proactively promotes consideration of rule of law issues relevant to parliamentary activity by providing rule of law analysis and opportunities for discussion of topical rule of law issues in Parliament.
- 5. Scrutinises rule of law questions raised by proposed legislation, constitutional developments, Government policy, international affairs and current events.
- 6. Considers rule of law issues both in and outside the UK.
